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
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



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AND GOD SAYS

"But just as he who called you is holy , so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.'" (1 Peter 1:15-16)

The problem with this command is that it is impossible for any of us to accomplish. Romans 3:23, reveals "that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory [holiness] of God. Thus, we have all condemned ourselves as unworthy of God's blessing and instead, deserve only His wrath. If this were the end of the story we would be in a hopeless mess, to say the least. But, praise God, it is not!

Though we have failed God and even turned our backs on Him, He has not forsaken us. He still loves us. And it is this truth that makes Christianity so different from all other faiths. Only the Christian God sent His son to die for us because He loves us so much. Furthermore, because Christ took our sins upon Himself and died in our place, He therefore is able to cover us with His own holiness, thereby satisfying the requirements of God that we "be holy as He is holy." In doing so, Jesus Christ has reconciled us to God and giving us peace with God. And because we are brought into a right relationship to God, through Christ, we are restored to an open and intimate relationship with God, not only for today, but for all of eternity.

The only condition to receive the holiness of Christ is that we must "believe in our heart that God raised Him (Christ) from the dead, and confess Him as Lord" of our life (Romans 10:9-10). It is at this point, that we many times wrongly respond to this message in two ways. First, we tend to believe with a head knowledge rather than a heart commitment, and second, we want the salvation that Christ has to offer but without surrendering our lives to Him — we are unwilling to make Him Lord and Master of our lives. But complete surrender, making Christ Savior and Lord is the only way. The result is that many people are so close to the truth, yet miss it by a mile.

Those who genuinely put their faith in Jesus and make Him Lord of their lives will "prove their repentance by their deeds" (Acts 26:20). Friend, do you put your trust in Jesus? I hope so. If you do, is your faith demonstrated by your deeds? This is what reveals genuine faith.


