Chairman Hendrickson declared the public hearing on the proposed renewable energy ordinance open at 8:30 am.

Tim Shevket from RWE Renewables talked about the windmill farms they are working to develop in the Towns of Hoard and Mayville. Tim submitted comments and suggestions to the Planning & Zoning Committee. He thanked the county for reaching out to them for comments. He made the following suggestions:

- Sec. 22-1469 Enforcement – suggested requesting a time period of 30 or 60 days put on to rectify incompleteness, before rejecting for noncompliance. Or, remove entirely.
- Sec. 22-1456 Compensation for Nonparticipating Residences – (b) Remove the greater of two percent or the increase in the CPI and limit it to 2%.
- Sec. 22-1450 Post Construction Filing Requirement – (a) Request 90 days extended to 180 days or have extension available to the applicant.
- Sec. 22-1451 Annual Reports – Request further clarification of what is expected on the annual report.
- Sec. 22-1453 Aerial Spraying – Request to reduce monetary compensation from ½ mile to ¼ mile.
- Sec. 22-1461 Financial Assurance – (c) Further clarification on what is acceptable to the county.

Chairman Hendrickson asked three times if there was any other public comment, there being none, the public hearing was closed at 8:45 am.

Chairman Hendrickson called the meeting to order at 8:45 am on April 19, 2022.

onded by Supervisor Zank to close the nominations, and cast a unanimous ballot for Supervisor Hendrickson for Chair. Voice vote, motion carried.

Chairman Hendrickson declared nominations in order for Vice-Chair. Supervisor Schindler nominated Supervisor Waichulis. There being no other nominations, motion by Supervisor Bakker seconded by Supervisor C. Rueth to close the nominations, and cast a unanimous ballot for Supervisor Waichulis for Vice Chair. an attorney from Marshfield. Marti addressed the changes RWE suggested in the Public Hearing. He does not recommend those changes, however, he believes there are a couple typos in Sec. 22-1438 (d) (1) and Sec. 22-1533 (d) (1) both paragraphs should be amended to insert **not limited**, so that the paragraph reads (1) Such requirements include, but are **not** limited to Motion by Supervisor Schindler seconded by Supervisor Molitor to amend the typos in Sec. 22-1438 and Sec. 22-1533 as discussed. Roll call vote on the amendment, motion carried. 29 yes, 0 no, 0 absent.

Supervisor Schindler suggested the Board send a resolution to the state asking for more local control.

Chairman Hendrickson yielded the floor to Derek Weyer to answer questions and explain the resolution. Clark County can't be more restrictive than the state.

Roll call vote on the first reading of Ordinance 240-4-22 as amended. Motion carried. 29 yes, 0 no and 0 absent.

Resolution 15-4-22 APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPENSATION POLICY presented. Motion by Supervisor Waichulis seconded by Supervisor Zank to approve the resolution as presented. Motion by Supervisor Krempasky seconded by Supervisor C. Rueth to lay the resolution on the table until the next meeting. Voice vote to table the resolution, motion carried.

Resolution 16-4-22 APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPENSATION POLICY – WAGE SCHEDULES presented. Motion by Supervisor Krempasky seconded by Supervisor Kodl to approve the resolution as presented. Motion by Supervisor Krempasky seconded by Supervisor Bower to lay the resolution on the table until the next meeting. Voice vote to table the resolution, motion carried.

Resolution 17-4-22 APPROVING UTILITY RIGHT OF WAY EASEMENT FOR DAIRYLAND POWER CO-OPERATIVE presented.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Clark County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the right of way easement set forth in Exhibit A.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the proceeds from this transaction shall be received into the Forestry and Parks, Program 1 Forestry Revenue Account (330.6210.474590).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk and Corporation Counsel are hereby authorized and directed to execute the easement upon terms set forth herein and Dairyland Power shall pay for applicable recording fees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Forestry and Parks Administrator or designee are hereby authorized to execute any documents to effectuate such transaction subject to the terms of this resolution and the easement.

Motion by Supervisor Zank seconded by Supervisor Krause to approve the resolution as presented. Supervisor C. Rueth yielded the floor to John Wendorski to answer questions and explain the resolution. Roll call vote, motion carried. 29 yes, 0 no and 0 absent.

Chairman Hendrickson appointed Supervisors Waichulis, Trunkel, Wilcox and Schindler to the Committee on Committees.

The Committee on Committees met from 10:30 am to 11:55 am. During this time the Board viewed a presentation on WI Farm Tech Days hosted by Clark County this July, 2022.

The slate of Standing Committees was presented (copy on file in the Clerk's office). Motion by Supervisor Bower seconded by Supervisor Krempasky to concur with the Chairman's appointment of committees. Voice vote, motion carried.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 19, 2022 at 7:30 pm.
