April 2, 2024

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the several towns, villages, cities, wards, and election districts of Clark County, on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, the following questions will be submitted to a vote of the people pursuant to law:

QUESTION 1: “Use of private funds in election administration. Shall section 7 (1) of article III of the constitution be created to provide that private donations and grants may not be applied for, accepted, expended, or used in connection with the conduct of any primary, election, or referendum?”

QUESTION 2: “Election officials. Shall section 7 (2) of article III of the constitution be created to provide that only election officials designated by law may perform tasks in the conduct of primaries, elections, and referendums?”

This referendum ballot is a result of 2023 Enrolled Joint Resolution 78, a copy of which can be viewed or downloaded from the Wisconsin Elections Commission website at <https://elections.wi.gov/memo/certification-referendum-question-and-type-notice-referendum-april-2-2024-spring-election> and also on the Legislature’s website at https://docs.legis.wisconsin.gov/2023/proposals/reg/sen/joint_resolution.

Historic Clark County truss bridge offered free of charge for relocation

Clark County, with assistance from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), is offering the historic Black River Bridge free of charge for relocation. The recipient must be willing to relocate this bridge from its current location on County G over the Black River in the city of Greenwood and maintain its historic integrity at a new location for 10 years.

The Black River Bridge is a two-span Warren through-truss bridge. The total length of the bridge is 288 feet; it is 28 feet, 2 inches wide.

Work and repairs on bridges must be made according to the Secretary of the Interior’s Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings and are subject to approval and review by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and WisDOT.

The recipient of the Black River Bridge must agree to relocate the structure to a suitable location and assume all future legal and financial responsibility for it. Potential recipients include private citizens, nonprofit organizations and town, city and county governments.

Interested parties must prepare and submit a proposal for Clark County, WisDOT and SHPO review. Proposals should follow guidelines specified in an information packet available by:

Requests for information packets must be submitted to the address or email address above no later than April 13, 2024. Requests received after this date cannot be guaranteed consideration. Proposals will be due 30 days from receipt of the information packet or no later than May 12, 2024.

Proposals will be selected based on the feasibility of the relocation and funding plan. Ownership of the bridge will be transferred at no cost after review and approval.

Construction of a new structure at the Black River Bridge’s present location is expected to begin in fall or winter 2024 and be completed in summer or fall 2025.

The City is accepting bids for:

- Perform a 3” asphalt Mill & Overlay to approximately 421’ x 41’ of asphalt pavement on W. 5th Street between Grand Avenue and Hewett Street. All millings to be hauled by the City for stockpiling.
- Provide approximately 500 tons of hot mix asphalt to be placed by the selected company for patching. This shall include separate pricing for both finish shaping with paving and paving only at 3”.
