Notice of Pending Application for Dam - Abandonment and Removal

Curtiss Lindner of Clark County Forestry and Parks Department (Clark County) has applied to the Department of Natural Resources for a permit to Dam - Abandonment and Removal. The project is located on Hay Creek in the NW 1/4 of NE 1/4, Section 11, Township 25, Range 04 W, Town of Foster, Clark County.

This project consists of removal of a 48-ft long, steel truss recreational bridge, demolition and removal of the deteriorated Clark County 16 Dam concrete control structure, and installation of a new conveyance system consisting of twin 96-inch culverts to pass Hay Creek beneath the Clark County recreational trail.

The Department will review the proposal provided by the applicant and any information from public comments and the public informational hearing. The Department will determine whether the proposal complies with ss. 1.11, 31.185, 31.253, and s. 30.208, Wis. Stats., and ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and ensure that the required mitigation meets the standards in s. 281.36(3r), Wis. Stats., if the project impacts wetlands.

The Department has made a tentative determination that it will issue the permit for the proposed activity. Any person may submit written comments by emailing jacob.nadeau@wisconsin.gov, by leaving a voice message at 715-520-7644, or writing to Jacob Nadeau, PO Box 397, Cumberland, WI 54829-0397 by mail. Comments should include the docket number or applicant name and should relate to whether the project meets the legal standards listed above. Comments must be submitted or postmarked no later than 30 days after the date on which the Department first publishes the notice on our Internet website.

If you would like to request a public informational hearing, the request must be submitted or postmarked within 20 days after the date on which the Department first publishes the notice on our Internet website. A request for hearing must include the docket number or applicant name and specify the issues that the party desires to be addressed at the informational hearing. If no hearing is requested, the Department will issue its decision without a hearing. If a hearing is held, comments must be submitted or postmarked no later than 10 days following the hearing date.

The final decision may be appealed as indicated in the decision document.
