Pledge of Allegiance.

Appointments

Resolution 7-3-25 APPROVING THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPENSATION POLICY UPDATES presented. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Clark County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Administrative Compensation Policy as set forth in Exhibit A effective April 6, 2025.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, employees shall transition to a step within their position's pay grade as follows:

The transition will be effective and be realized on April 6, 2025, and placement on the schedule will be determined using the employee's wage rate as of April 5, 2025.

Employees will be placed on the wage schedule in the position's pay grade at the step equal to their rate of pay or nearest to their rate of pay that provides an increase.

Employees at Step 7 and who do not have a current step increase anniversary date will be placed at the step that provides at least a 2% increase and their step anniversary date shall be April 6.

Employees who increased to Step 7 in 2024 shall be placed at the step equal to or nearest to their rate of pay that provides an increase, and will maintain their previous step anniversary date.

Employees placed at Step 1 on April 6, 2025, shall receive their next step on their current step anniversary date or the first full pay period following 6 months after April 6, 2025, whichever is sooner. Employees who receive their next step the first full pay period following 6 months after April 6, 2025, shall have their step anniversary date amended accordingly.

Employees placed at Step 2 through 10 on April 6, 2025, shall advance to the next step on their current step anniversary date.

Employees that will experience an overall reduction in expected annual salary for 2025 based on the implementation plan shall receive a 2-step advancement on their next step anniversary date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, funds to pay for the transition set forth in this resolution shall derive from Clark County's Contingency Account 13900000-579000.

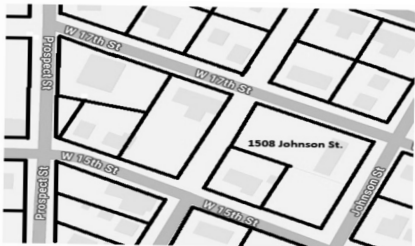
